Meriam people of Mer Island have their New Year's day uniquely celebrated annually from 1st of January. The celebration runs for one week and the first day of celebration is called by a traditional name "Pata Amu". The second and third day events are traditionally called Lugasib/ Lugaraimer. The new year's day and week-long celebration events signify Community Reconciliation to the Meriam people of Mer Island. It has been a traditional event practiced only by the Mer Meriam people for so many years.
